How to install Java and the Keyboard class under Windows

This guide describes how to install Java SDK and the **Keyboard** class under Windows.

The guide assumes a basic knowlegde of Windows terminology and operations.

1 Installation of Java SDK

- 1. Install the Java SDK by running the install program (j2sdk-1_4_0_01-windows-i586.exe) and follow the instructions.
- 2. Open or create C:\autoexec.bat in a text editor (e.g. Notepad) and add the following lines at the end of the file:

SET PATH=C:\j2sdk1.4.0_01\bin;%PATH% SET CLASSPATH=.;C:\java

NOTE: The folder "C:\j2sdk1.4.0.01\bin" is the folder where it is assumed the java interpreter (java.exe) and the java compiler (javac.exe) are installed. If you have installed java SDK elsewhere (or you are using a different version) you have to change "C:\j2sdk1.4.0.01\bin" to that. An example could be that you have installed it under "C:\program files\j2sdk1.4.0.01\bin" and in that case you should add this:

SET PATH=C:\program files\j2sdk1.4.0_01\bin;%PATH% SET CLASSPATH=.;C:\java

3. Reboot the machine.

2 Installation of the Keyboard class

Method 1:

- 1. Download the cs1jar.zip file from CD that accompanies the book. This file is compressed.
- 2. Extract the cs1.jar file. This is a Java Archive (JAR) file containing the cs1 package.
- 3. Store the cs1.jar file in the following two folders: C:\j2sdk1.4.0_01\jre\lib\ext and C:\Program Files\Java\j2re1.4.0_01\lib\ext

Method 2:

- 1. Copy the **Keyboard.java** file from the CD that accompanies the book to the folder C:\java\cs1
- 2. Click the "start button" and then "run..." (Danish: "start-knappen" og "kør...") and type "command" and press "Enter".
- 3. A dos terminal opens. Go to the folder "c:\java\cs1" and type "javac Keyboard.java" and press "Enter".
